CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Let's see. Sam, are you going to lead us in the reading of the affirmations?

MR. CHILK: The first one is 78-613. This is a response to an NRDC petition for rulemaking which NRC was requested to immediately adopt interim regulations settir standards for shallow-land disposal of TRU and other low-level radioactive wastes, as well as prepare a broad program adequate for the environmental impact statement.

Unanimously the Commission voted to partially deny the petition. We circulated to you on the 18th the proposed Federal Register notice, and have picked up all of your modifications that you mag to that.

I would ask you to affirm the vote.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Aye.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Aye.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Aye.

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: Aye.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: So ordered.

MR. CHILK: The second one is 78-690. It's the KMC petition to defer implementation of security personnel qualification, training and equipment requirements. The Commission, again, unanimously denied the petition. We circulated to you on the 24th the Federal Register notice with

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all of the requirements and a proposed 1 tter to KMC. We've heard from everyone but Commissioner Bradford. I understand that that's no problem. We previously denied the petition. The letter was in question. I'm not saying the office has no problem with it. If there is, we'll work it out.

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: It seems to me that we should deny the petition.

MR. CHILK: I would ask you to affirm the denial of the petition.

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: Certainly I'm prepared to say that I'm prepared to be outvoted on it.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Why don't you just abstain, then, and I'll ask the others of us to join in voting it down.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Aye.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Aye.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Aye.

So ordered.

Okay, that's it.
