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;sh	1	CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: The room will please quiet
	2	the assembled multitude. I would like to ask my colleagues to
	3	join me in holding a short notice meeting on an affirmation
	4	item.
	5	(A chorus of ayes.)
	6	CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: So ordered.
	7	MR. CHILK: This is SECY-79-59-A, a proposed amendment
	3	to 10-CFR, Part 73.55, to extend the implementation date for
	9	certain complementary and alternative measures for the
	10	protection against the insider threat.
	11	The purpose of the paper would extend the time for
	12	implementation of pat down searches until February 1, 1980.
	13	Four of you have voted to approve that paper. I have not
	14	heard from Commissioner Gilinsky. I believe he proposed to
	15	abstain.
	16	COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: I would extend it for a
	17	brief interval.
	18	MR. CHILK: Commissioner Ahearne, in his approval,
	19	has suggested that the period be restricted to November 1st.
	20	CCMMISSIONER AHEARNE: That was the only grounds I
	21	voted to approved it.
	22	MR. CHILK: I have three votes, then.
	23	CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: What was the base date?
	24	COMMISSIONER AHEARNE: Six months.
	25	COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: Why dr it you consider me to

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ysh	1	be joining John at November 1st, and that way, there would be
	2	three of us who don't think it ought to be any longer than
	3	that.
	4	COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: We are just making substantive
	5	re-arrangements to the paper. I would like to have further
5	6	time to consider it since this is just an affirmation item.
	7	MR. CHILK: If we don't act on this paper, then the
	8	pat down search becomes effective because it expires
	9	COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Well, we're just violating our
	10	own rules. We're supposed to come to the table and vote on
	.1.1	the issue that is before us and not discuss it. And here we
	12	are having discussion and making a fundamental ange in what
	13	has been decided.
	14	That is not an affirmation.
	15	COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Well, we have done that
	16	before.
	17	COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: No, by God, we haven't.
	18	, MR. CHILK: We really haven't, except that this one
	19	came upon us just at a particular moment in time. All of you
	20	have been in meetings all day today. We did go into this
	21	meeting with three of you voting to approve the paper with the
	22	date that the paper calls for, February 8th, Commissioner
	23	Ahearne saying November.
	24	COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Well, we could vote on a
	25	quick discussion meeting.

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; sh	1	CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Let's go back and unaffirm it.
	2	I think we have to act on it. Those in favor of a short notice
	3	meeting to discuss the problem before us with the pat down
	4	search rule, will please say aye.
	5	(A coords of ayes.)
	6	CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: So ordered.
	7	I take it that the staff has asked for six months.
	8	MR. CHILK: The staff asked for six months on the
	9	basis that you've got to assess the hearing board
	10	recommendations. You've just gotten a new paper on that and
	11	they believe that it will take you several months to do that,
	12	following which they ve got to put in the implementation.
	13	And that was their reason for selecting February.
	14	CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Gentlemen, we can make it November
	15	if a majority want to go there. But I think that that is
	16	a guaranteed extension because I don't think that the
	17	commission, since the commission has to take an action on the
	18	clearance rule, and since that is a some st difficult matter,
	19	it seems to me where I must say it is not clear to me where
		one goes from here on it.
	21	I don't think that there is any possibility of
	22	clearing the pat down search rule area by 1 November. I
	20	would recommend the six months. But if those of you would lik
	24	to keep it on a short leash would continue to prefer to do
	25	that, either whether you agree or disagree with me about an

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apparent need to come back on November 1st and extend in order 1 Jsh to get action. If a majority lies that way, I have no 2 objection. 3 COMMISSIONER AHEARNE: My first preference, frankly, 4 was for not extending it. But upon rereading it and sort of 5 semi-reluctantly, or reluctantly going along with an extension, 6 I believe that the three months was about as far as I could 7 realistically say that I could go. 8 But I would have no problem with not extending it. 9 CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Well, I don't know. Do you 10 remember the discussions about that? 11 COMMISSIOHER AHEARNE: Yes. 12 'HAIRMAN HENDRIE: I don't know if that happened 13 14 before you came. COMMISSIONER AHEARNE: Well, I have been to a lot 15 of stuff on it. 16 CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: All right. I have a vote for × . 17 November 1st, willingness to extend until November 1st. 13 19 Who else? COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: I've already voted. 20 CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: I will vote February 1st. Vic? 21 COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: November 1st. 22 COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: I will join John in November 23 1st, with a request that, in fact, if it has not been dealt 24 with by then, give us a little more warning. 25

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MR. CHILK: Yes. I think the staff was late getting 1 it up. I think we goofed in not inviting your attention to 2 the fact that we didn't pick this up immediately. 3 CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: It came upon us all of a sudden 4 5 here. MR. CHILK: Nobody picked it up until last night. 6 CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: All right. I will rule that a 7 majority of the commission is willing to extend until November 8 1st. Please note that, if I may, Dick, that Commissioner 9 Kennedy and I agree with the extension, but think that the 10 originally requested staff mark of February 1st would have 11 12 been more appropriate. 13 COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: I would guess the November 14 Ist deadline would drive us toward at least an early cut in 15 September at the clearance rule procedure. CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Yes. That is one of the things 16 17 that we've got to turn to after we get off the budget. And 13 also, as part of that, why somebody, the counsel or somebody 19 has to figure out some ways of getting from where we are now 20 to wherever we're going to go. 21 I felt kind of defeated by the complexity with which 22 it ended. 23 Okay. We have an order to deal with the thing. The 24 Secretary will please issue it. 25 (Whereupon, at 5:30 p.m., the hearing adjourned.)

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
