
Dear Mr. Hendrie:

Dear Mr. Holland,

We are several members of a newly formed group called C-M Citizens for Safe Energy (C_M stands for Chesterfield and Marlboro Counties). We are concerned constituents who write to you for some information, and to express our concern regarding nuclear related issues.

As you know, South Carolina has thousands of trucks carrying nuclear waste on its roads, on the way to the dumping ground, Barnwell. This morning's local news told us that several hundred truckloads will bring the Three Mile Island waste here in the future. This is a constant danger to our homes and our people. Do you know the roads that are used for this transportation? Do you have, and can you provide us with a schedulrule of the frequency of the trucks carrying radioactive wastes to the burying ground area? We ask these questions because since so many trips pass through the State, and many thru Cheraw itself, we know the risk of accidents, trailer trucks tipping over, or otherwise, is big. We want our community to be prepared in the event of an accident.

We also want to know Mr. Holland if there is presently any pending legisla-tion regarding the limiting of the truck routes to less populated areas.

Finally, we express our concern to you that nearby, in Wallace S.C. there is a nuclear power plant being begun. CP & L is in charge, and at an earlier date, denied that it would be nuclear. Now, we have word that it will be, a nuclear power plant. Can you please verify for us and get some up-to-date information on this--such as the permit register, etc Thank you for your attention to our letter, Mr. Holland. We hope our concern about the hazards of nuclear related materials and transport will be your concern too.

We await your information and sharing with us. We are also writing this letter to the Nuclear Advisory Commission and to our Mayor Jackson.
