We offer the following responses to the apparent Items of Noncompliance in the referenced Inspection Report.

## NOTICE OF VIOLATION

As required by Technical Specification 6.8.1.e, concerning implementation of EM Procedure EM-100 as specified in Section 4.3.1.1.f, there should be a portal monitor at the guardhouse (Emergency Assembly Center).

Contrary to the above, on January 22 and 24, 1979, the portal monitor failed to properly operate.

<u>Response</u>: Upon notification of the two cited instances, the portal monitor at the guardhouse was checked for operability and appeared to function properly. This instrument was checked on a subsequent inspection and the inspector did not detect any malfunction of the monitor. We feel no further corrective action is necessary; however, in order to avoid any future noncompliance of this type, the requirement for a portal monitor at the guardhouse will be deleted from the Emergency Plan EM-100. Chem/Rad technicians, properly trained, will be utilized to clear evacuated personnel prior to their release from the plant site. All procedural changes will be implemented prior to 1 May 1979.
