Request for Deletion of Stage Monitoring Requirement Contained

in Environmental Protection Program

AECM-79/59

The report entitled "Environmental Protection Program Respecting Construction of Grand Gulf Nuclear Station Units 1 and 2" requires that continuous recorders be utilized at two stations on each sediment retention basin to document water stage. The report further states that "the recorded stage will be correlated with surface water quality measurements to document the effectiveness of the sediment control structures in reducing sediment contents in water discharged from the basins." Analysis of the stage and suspended solid recordings at both basins has shown that the hypothesis that these two variables correlate can be rejected within ninety-five percent confidence. Therefore, we request that the requirement to monitor stage he deleted from the program.
