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## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Okay. The Secretary will now lead us in the reading of the affirmations.

MR. CHILK: SECY-79-327, in which the Commission approved amendments to 10 CFR 50 and 70 to provide for onsite office space for resident inspectors and immediate facility access to NRC inspection personnel.

All of you concurred with that paper and I will ask you to affirm your votes.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Aye.

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: Aye.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Aye.

COMMISSIONER AHEARNE: Aye.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Aye.

So ordered.

MR. CHILK: SECY-79-294, which is the reduction of the radiography overexposures in which all of you have agreed that a publication of the proposed amendments to 10 CFR Part 34 with modifications would be geared into the proposed amendments and circulated to you on the first of June.

And I would ask you to affirm your votes on this item.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Aye.

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: Aye.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Aye.

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COMMISSIONER AHEARNE: Aye.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Aye.

So ordered.

MR. CHILK: I have taken the Seabrook seismic shutdown out because there has been an agreement amongst you, as I understand it, to modify the proposed order and that will be coming up next week.

The last paper is SECY-78-682, which is a revision of NRC regulation governing ownership of stocks, bonds and other security interests which has just been approved, and so recently, that I am going to ask Trip to lead you through it.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: I approved?

(Simultaneous discussion).

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Your office outvoted you five

MR. CHILK: The Chairman -- I have not had a vote from Mr. Bradford, although I understand --

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: You have been told that

MR. CHILK: -- told that it can be affirmed.

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: That I was prepared to be outvoted on those areas where that seems likely.

MR. ROTHSCHILD: Can I go through the major points of this paper and then make --

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(Simultaneous discussion)

COMMISSONER KENNEDY: Are we going to sit here and go through this paper?

The answer is no, I'm not.

I've already been through it four times, and that is enough for me.

MR. CHILK: If one Commissioner is not ready to act on it, I think under our rules -- (Inaudible.)

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: We better stick strongly to the rules we firmly established, that we don't discuss papers at affirmations.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: That's right.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: So, you know we will pull it and --

MR. CHILK: I take responsibility. I weakened to the argument of General Counsel and tried to let him lead you through it.

(Simultaneous discussion and laughter.)

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: We urge that such argument from General Counsel not be entertained in the future, much less given.

MR. CHILK: Not from the individual, his office.

MR. BICKWIT: 't doesn't sound very good to me.

(Laughter.)

COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: As I understood it, though,

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there was some good reason for its speediness, having to do with statements that had to be filed before July 1. So maybe it would be better to schedule it for an early date.

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: That's right. Yes, you better take a look so it can go right back on.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Fine with me.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Commissioners who have not had the opportunity to do so, might try to focus on it before we get to the table the next time.

COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: I will take that kindly.

(Laughter.)

CHAIRMAN HENDRIE: Okay.

(Whereupon, at 4:15 p.m., the hearing in the above-entitled matter was adjourned.)

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
