Moreover, I specifically request that you itemize such exemptions with particular reference to the portions of each document being withheld pursuant to the exemptions claimed and that you justify such exemptions pursuant to the requirements of <u>Vaughn</u> v <u>Rosen</u>, 484 F.2d 820 (D.C.
