FOR LEAVE TO INTERVENE

I Charles Andrew Pérez hereby petition for leave to intervene as a full party in this proceeding pursuant to the Notice of 6-18-79 published at 44 F.R. 35062. I

am entitled to intervene as a full party by virtue of the following facts and reasons:

1. I was born, grew up and now reside within fifty (50) miles of the site of the proposed plant, and my base of normal, everyday activities is within a fifty (50) mile radius of the site.

2. I have a direct and personal interest and concern in the health and safety of myself and the many members of my family, and in our use and

enjoyment of the natural resources within a fifty (50) mile radius of the plant.
3. I contend these interests will be injured by the construction and operation of the proposed plant and the increased radioactivity and physical harm to the environment caused by the construction of this plant if a construction permit is granted.

4. I have worked in the oil drilling industry of Texas, and have seen the consequences of the short cuts taken by industry when dealing with construction and high pressure open ation. I am justifiably alarmed when I studied Preliminary Safety Analysis Report Volume 18 and read I tem No. Q2-3.39 "Your response to I tem Q1-3.21 is unacceptable. It is the staff's position that a structural integrity test of the Drywell is required. Provide a definite commitment to comply with this requirement."
Response: Houston Lighting and Power disagrees
with the staff bosition that a structural integrity test at 115 percent of design pressure
is required. Various avenues of appeal are is required. Various avenues of how being considered.

The Drywell contains the motor drive system for the critical control rods. I am alarmed

that Houston Lighting and Power want to cut

quality control and testing in such a critical area of the nuclear reactor facilities. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff has had some experience with nuclear reactor operation in contrast to Houston Lighting and Powers lack of experience and true concern. As a United States citizen, voter, and customer of this utility company I oppose construction of this plant. 5. I feel that a spanish translation of the Final Environmental Statement must be made available for those citizens living within a (50) fifty mile radius of the proposed plant facilities. This small effort to inform those citizens of Mexican decent whom may not read english is the least that must be done to respect thier hights to be informed of such potentially dire changes of thier environment.

6. I failed to file a Petition for Leave to Intervene pursuant to the Board's notices of May 31. Vene pursuant to the Board's notices of the restrictions on permissible contentions contained in those notices. I would greatly appreciate any and all inform-mation the Commission can make available to me to me stay informed and educated on the subject of Nuclear Energy.
