I would appreciate your full consideration of the effect the closing of nine nuclear power plants will have on the availability of power during the peak summer season.



NE HAVE LEARNED THE NJCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION IS CONSIDERING CLOSING THE 9 OPERATING NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS WITH BABCOCK AND WILCOX PRESSURIZED WATER REACTORS. THIS WOULD INCLUCE THE ARKANSAS NUCLEAR ONE AT RUSSELLVILLE ARKANSAS WHICH IS PART OF THE MIDDLE SOUTH POWER SUPPLY SYSTEM. LOSS OF THIS 836 MEGAWATT UNIT WILL REDUCE OUR SEMMER PEAK MARGIN TO LESS THAN 1 PERCENT, AN UNACCEPTABLY LOW MARGIN. THIS ASSURES OUR INABILITY TO MEET LOAD THIS SUMMER. THE FACT THAT ANDTHER 6200 MW OF CAPTORY WILL BE LOST IF THE OTHER 8 PLANTS MEANS THAT PURCHASE POWER WIL, NOT BE AVAILABLE AT ANY PRICE. THE LOSS OF THE ARKANSAS UNIT IS THE EQUIVALENT OF 800,000 BARRELS OF OIL PER MONTH IN ADDITIONAL IMPORTS, THE CURRENT COST OF IMPORTED RESIDUAL OIL IS \$14 PER BARREL, PLEASE INTERCEDE URGENTLY WITH THE APPROPRIATE AUTHORITIES TO PREVENT THIS NEEDLESS AND HIGHLY INFLATIONARY ACTION.*
