# Article A-I RESEARCH TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

(a) The unclassified scope of work under this contract entitled, "A Manual of Energy Analysis Methodology for Programs Plant Siting: The Energy Value of Land" is as follows:

The contractor will perform further development of the net energy analysis methodology, application of this methodology to a case study, and the compilation of a manual on using the methodology.

The first phase of the project will be to analyze an actual siting case study to be selected by the sponsoring agency utilizing the net energy analysis model developed primarily in earlier stages of the project. The general model will be evaluated by the sponsoring agency and then applied to the actual case study. The resulting analysis and conclusions will be summarized in a report to be submitted to the sponsoring agency.

The second phase of the project will be to assess the net energy analytic method as it compares to other, more traditional methods of evaluation, such as economic cost/benefit analysis. A clear documentation of points of comparison and contrast will be made, especially as related to actual usage in a case study. This phase of the project must include a clear, non-technical explanation of the net energy analysis methodology.

The third phase of the project will be the assembling of information and results obtained during the entire course of the project into a concise user manual suitable for analysis of case studies such as are performed by the sponsoring agency. Every effort will be made to orient this phase of the project to user needs, and the contractor will assist by means of briefings, a seminar, and other methods to ensure clear understanding by the sponsoring agency. A review of the manual by the sponsoring agency will be accommodated so as to incorporate suggestions for change in the manual to improve its utility.

(b) The Principal Investigator expects to devote the following approximate amount(s) of time to the contract work:
