Dear Sir,

This is a request from Concerned Citizens for information concerning the Crystal River Nuclear Power Plant in Florida.

We are told that the NRC has approved the start-up of this reactor but see no evidence of the Utility's concern for public health and safety.

If the NRC is responsible for public health and safety measures and public protection against nuclear radioactive contamination why are we, the Citrus County taxpayers, being saddled with new costs of monitoring and other emergency equipment that we wouldn't need if it wasn't for this Nuclear "Trojan Horse"?
