Dear Mr. Yarga:

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On July 27, PSQ submitted its response to the regulatory staff's construction permit requirements with respect to TML-2. Subsequently, your Project Manager. Or. Cecil O. Thomas, has discussed several items with our Manager, Licensing and Compliance, Yaughn L. Conrad, in connection with the preparation of a Safety Evaluation Report supplement. Based on those conversations, we wish to clarify PSO's intent in connection with several issues. These explanations are intended to augurant and carry the same weight as the commitments made in our referenced document. It is PSO's express intent to document the implementation of these THL-2 related commitments in the FSAR.

- Fage 5 PSO analysis of accidents and anticipated operational occurrences will use Regulatory Guida 1.70, Revision 2. The anelysis will include explying single failures chosen so that the dynamic forces on the safety and resiter valves are maximized.
- · Page 6 PSO will determine a method acceptable to the regulatory staff to provide a reliable safety and relief valve position indication in the control room for the ningteen reactor main steam safety/relief valves in each nuclear steam supply system. It is expected that such indication will be derived from a reliable valve position detection device or a reliable indication of flow in the discharge pipe.
- > Page 7 PSO will utilize the analysis described in WWREG 0578. Appendix A. Section 2.1.9 to form a basis for operator training and procedure development to the end of aiding the operator in recognizing and mitigating inadequate core cooling. .

Page 25 - PSD will assign normal duties to the shift technical advisors that pertain to the engineering aspects of assuring safe operation of the plant, including the review and evaluation of operating experience.

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- Page 28 PSO will maintain the set of as built drawings and other records as described in AMSI M45.2.9-1974.
- Page 45 Section it PSO recognizes that information derived from the instrumentation described in MUREG 0578, Appendix A. Section 2.1.8 will be related to the emergency plan action levels.
- Page 45 Section iii PSO recognizes that communication between the Emergency Operations Center and the Technical Support Center described in NUREG 0578, Appendix A, Section 2.2.2.b is required. Horeover, we will evaluate the relationship between the two centers is establishing locations and instrumentation provided therein.
- Page 46 Section y PSO recognizes that local coordination, as well as state agencies, will be required in development of the BFS radiological emergency response plan. The draft state plan addresses the requir local jurisdiction planning as a subset of the state activity. The local agreements will be documented in the BFS Emergency Plan at the time of FSAR submittal.

We understand that upon receipt of these clarifications the SER supplement will be issued in the next day or two.
