This is to advise you that our organization views with considerable alarm the proposal to establish a nuclear power installation at Sedro Wooley, Washington State.

Such a plant, if constructed, would pose a hazard to millions of dollars worth of fish which our members depend on for a livelihood.

We, therefore, wholeheartedly endorse the intervention prepared by Mr. Rod Marining on behalf of the Greenpeace Foundation. Further, we are prepared to provide Mr. Marining with expert evidence as to the extent of possible losses caused by the Sedro Wooley project.

Finally, we regret the delay in tendering our petition on this vital matter. However, it has only recently been brought to our attention via the mass media how imminent the project is; the geographic proximity which will affect our vital interests in the fishing industry; and the possible risks which may be involved.
