

Dear Commissioner,

I would suggest that upon being presented with the recommendation on the Material Control and Accounting Task Force Report, you question whether any value-impact analysis was done on the objectives as stated in the report. Management in the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards is not giving you all of the results of the analysis that has been performed because they do not consider it to be in their own personal best interests. It can be shown that many of the objectives in the Task Force Report are not cost-beneficiand because of the seige mentality in NMSS, this led management to the conclusion that such results would reflect unfavorably on them.

Forgive me for not signing this letter but I have seen what has happened to others within NMSS who have tried to get additional information to the Commission contrary to the desires of management. I am certain that if it were known who called the above facts to your attention, there would be swift retaliation against me.
