FOR SAFE SHUTDOWN EARTHQUAKE

During seismic review (IEB 79-07), 4 snubbers on Recirculation Loop pipes were determined to be undersized for the Safe Shutdown Earthquake (0.15g). However, the snubbers meet the Operating Basis Earthquake criteria. The snubbers were declared inoperable and the plant will start shutting down for snubber replacement 5/11.

Media interest is expected because of recent shutdowns of five reactors due to seismic analyses techniques. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts has been informed. A press release is not planned by the licensee and/or NRC.
