Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. Spessard of this office on February 20, 22, 27 and 23 and March 1, 1974 at the Three Mile Island 1 Plant, Middletown, Feunsylvania of activities authorized by AFC License No. CPPR-40 and to the discussions of our findings held by Mr. Spessard with Mr. Merbein, Mr. Miller and other members of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection, and to subse went telephone discussions between Mr. Spessard and Mr. Miller on March 4 and 5, 1974.

Areas examined during this inspection are described in the Regulatory Operations Inspection Report which is enclosed with this letter. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector.

During this inspection, it was found that one of your activities appeared to be in violation of AEC requirements. The item and reference to the pertiment requirements are listed in the enclosure to this letter. This letter constitutes a notice sent to you pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.201 of the AEC's "Eules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations. Although Section 2.201 requires you to submit to this office, within 20 days of your receipt of this notice a written statement of explanation, we note that this violation was corrected prior to the completion of our inspection and therefore, no response with respect to this matter is required.

In accordance with Section 2.790 of the AEC's "Rules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the AEC's Public Document Room. If this report contains any information that you (or your contract :) believe to be proprietary, it is

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necessary that you make a written application within 20 days to this office to withhold such information from public disclosure. Any such application must include a full statement of the reasons on the basis of which it is claimed that the information is proprietar, and should be prepared so that proprietary information identified in the application is contained in a separate part of the document. If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified period, the report will be placed in the Public Document Room.

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No reply to this letter is required; however, if you should have any questions concerning this inspection, we will be pleased to discuss them with you.
