The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has very recently amended its regulations which are the subject of the Edlow petition. We understand the NRC Staff is currently evaluating the comments filed with respect to the amendments to 10 C.F.R. Part 73 to determine what, if any, modifications thereof are needed. We also understand that the Department of Transportation will shortly publish a proposed rule on highway routing of radioactive materials (DOT Docket No. HM-164).

In view of the several developments affecting physical security for highway shipments of radioactive materials, the members of the Group believe that further study is required of the matters raised in the Edlow petition. In general, the members of the Group agree that motor carriers should have the responsibility for complying with requirements of the NRC that are under the carriers' control. There are also aspects of compliance with the NRC's requirements for physical security in transit for which shippers may wish to assume direct responsibility.

The Group and its members reserve the right to offer further comments on the Edlow petition in light of developments affecting the highway shipment of spent fuel and should the NRC propose rulemaking in response to the petition.
