Dear Jack:

At our meeting on November 14 and 15, you asked whether the intervenors and the NRC staff would consider developing various categories of documents which might be excluded from production currently under way by PG&E. We have reviewed that question, including the specific proposal you made, and have agreed that certain categories of documents may be exempted from production.

The category that you asked us to consider was complaints to PG&E from retail customers concerning service by PG&E. We believe that so long as those documents are retained and, if needed, can be made available for inspection by the intervenors and staff, they may be currently withheld from PG&E's production effort.

The second category which we believe can be exempted from production at this time involves files dealing with various types of legislation. In all files containing copies of bills or proposed acts introduced into the California Legislature or the United States Congress, you may exclude from production at this time all copies of bills and acts themselves, unless a particular copy contains marginal notations of any kind. In many cases, it has been our experience that bills and acts constitute the bulk of the documents in these types of files and consequently this exclusion should save PG&E from considerable production burden. It is important to note that no memoranda concerning any bills and acts are included within this exclusion.
