Gentlemen:

In our response to I E Bulletin 79-24, dated October 31, 1979, we identified the Arkansas Nuclear One-Unit 2 refueling water tank overflow line as being a possible freeze hazard. Subsequent evaluation has revealed that this is not the case. The overflow line in question is adequately protected from freezing for the following reasons:

- 1) The temperature of the water in the tank is maintained above 70°F.
- There is no water in the overflow line unless the tank is overfilled.
- 3) The overflow line is 18 inches in diameter.

Thus, no modifications will be made to the overflow line for freeze protection purposes.
