Dear Mr. Wroblewski:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 156 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Material License No. 13-00133-02 for St. Vincent Hospital & Health Care Center in accordance with your request dated June 18, 2019. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the NRC Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In your letters dated June 18, 2019, and July 24, 2019, you described the use of radioactive material at four locations of use: St. Vincent Anderson Regional Hospital located at 2201 Jackson Street, Anderson Indiana; St. Vincent Hospital-Indianapolis Breast Cancer located at 8550 Naab Road, Indianapolis, Indiana; St. Vincent Seton Specialty Hospital located at 8050 Township Line Road, Indianapolis, Indiana; and St. Vincent Hospital-Carmel Breast Center located at 13420 North Meridian Street, Carmel, Indiana. You also confirmed that all residual licensed material used at these locations had been removed – such that any remaining residual radioactivity is within the limits of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Part 20, Subpart E.

Based on its review of information pertaining to the specific uses of radioactive material at each of the four locations and in accordance with 10 CFR 30.36 (j), the staff has concluded that residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities in these locations of use does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required. Your facilities at St. Vincent Anderson Regional Hospital located at 2201 Jackson Street, Anderson Indiana; St. Vincent Hospital-Indianapolis Breast Cancer located at 8550 Naab Road, Indianapolis, Indiana; St. Vincent Seton Specialty Hospital located at 8050 Township Line Road, Indianapolis, Indiana; and St. Vincent Hospital-Carmel Breast Center located at 13420 North Meridian Street, Carmel, Indiana are suitable for unrestricted use.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. The NRC may issue a notice of violation, imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
