

Dear Mr. Hendrie:

We strongly oppose a second unit for the Pilgrim Nuclear Plant in Plymouth. First of all, we have a huge unit now, which is quite enough for us to cope with. Like most Plymouth citizens we never dreamed that there could be a second. We have faced serious problems in its operation; pollution of sea life, mechanical mishaps, waste disposal errors, and radiation exposure.

Secondly, Plymouth has grown since Plant I was started. It is one of the fastest growing towns in Massachusetts, doubling in the past ten years. We have a year round population of 30,000 and a summer population of 80,000. It is foolhardy to add a second plant in this densely settled area!

We urge you to deny permission to Boston Edison to start Pilgrim Plant II. We also urge you to set up much stricter and more closely supervised safety requirements for Pilgrim Plant I.

We have been tax payers in Plymouth for 45 years, live in one of Plymouth's historic houses and are deeply concerned with the future of "America's Home Town."
