It has just been brought to my attention that on Movember 9, 1978 Dr. Fhilip Cote of the Munlear Hegulatory Commission and a group of persons, including representatives from the New Magland Power Co., visited an area in southern Bhode Island which is to be included in the New Hagland Power Company application for a muclear station containing NEP-1 and MER-2. This area, which is to be considered as an alternate site to the Heval Auriliary Landing Field in Charlestown, E. I. is to be designated as the Moonstone Reach site, and is adjacent to the Trustom Fund Wildlife Befuge.

I call your attention to the fact that my gift to the Department of Interior of the Truston Fond Wildlife Beruge was made with the implicit understanding that this would remain an unfettered wildlife area available to the general public. I am therefore appalled by the action of the NHC in even visiting this unique area to assess its value as a possible nuclear plant site. Not only would such a use violate my trust with the Department of Interior, but it would also violate the trust of the public in the Department of Interior's determination to protect conservation areas.

The Trustom Fund Wildlife Metuge, together with the Andubon Society's land adjacent thereto, the Finigret Conservation Area and the proposed FWS Wildlife Metuge on the Maval Air Landing Field will constitute a group of contiguous areas which should be managed to protect their natural state. Clearly, bureaucretic ENC and commercial indifference to the importance of maintaining conservation areas is tentamount to the rape of our limited state resources.

To entertain the thought that a muclear plant might be sited adjacent to the fractom Road Vildlife Bufuge on Moonstone Beach within this conservation complex is little short of incenity. I unge that you use the full wright of your position and office to halt my plan for a muclear plant anymbers within this unique conservation gros.
