My husband and I are in our early twenties and we have bought a house and are raising a family in the small town of Guy, Texas. After reading an article in the Fort Bend Suburbia - Reporter (Wed. May 2, 1979) I have become extremely concerned about the proposed Nuclear Power Facility at Allen's Creek less than 50 miles from here. I remember studying about Nuclear Power in my Honors Chemistry class and the difference between Nuclear Power Reactors and Nuclear type bombs but still no one can convince me that Nuclear Power Plants are safe from foreign attack or sabotage or as we recently experienced from uncontrollable accidents.

nosatisfactory (to me) method of disposing of nuclear waste is available. If this plant is to be allowed to be built then at least it can be improved upon. The Allen's Creek facility "is expected to emit 36,000 curies per year of radioactive material." This is compared to 1,500 curies per year of radioactive material. I drink water from an underground well (as we all do in this area) and again our home is within 50 miles of the proposed Allen's Creek facility. Such a "dirty" plant can only harm my family it would seem. We can't afford to move and I don't see what right Houston Lighting & Power has to increase the risk of Cancer in my family or in the whole Houston Area. **POOR ORIGINAL**

I would like to request an environmental impact statement for the proposed facility at Allen's Creek and be made a full party to the Allen's Creek construction permit proceedings. And no, I'm not sitting here crying no nuclear plants but let me have all the comforts energy affords. We have

no airconditioning or central heat
