SUBJECT: BOMB THREAT

On August 21, at 6:25 a.m., an unknown male called the station switchboard and told the operator: "There is a bomb planted in the reactor that is going to go off between 9:00 and 10:00; I did it last night at work". The licensee notified the county law enforcement agency, evacuated the affected area and conducted a search with negative results. The site construction progress is 80 percent complete, and there is fuel on site. Several previous bomb threats at this facility are being investigated by local law enforcement agencies.

Media interest is not expected and a press release is not planned by the licensee or the NRC. The State of South Carolina has been informed.

The IAT was notified.
