Please note the license currently authorizes another intermediate consignee - Rotterdam Nuclear - in the Netherlands.

The first shipment to this intermediate consignee is scheduled for February 1, 1979.

Presently, only one shipment is scheduled for export to this intermediate consignee. The shipment will consist of 2 hydrostatic bearings which must be installed in a coolant pump for the Leibstady reactor. It is our understanding that the value of these bearings is less than \$100,000.
