Dear Sir:

This is a request for records under the Freedom of Information Act and the provisions of 10 CFR Pact 9, Subpart A - "Freedom of Information Act Regulations."

The information sought is an annotated listing specifying the main areas of concern of groups who have filed a petition for leave to intervene in proceedings before the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and its associated licensing boards. The proceedings of interest are:

Reactor construction permit and operating license hearings (including site suitability proceedings;
Fuel cycle facility (uranium mills, fuel fabricators, fuel reprocessing plants, waste disposal operations) licensing proceedings;
Generic Rulemaking Proceedings on Emergency Core Cooling Systems,
Appendix I to 10 CFR Part 50, Environmental Effects of the Uranium
Fuel Cycle, Environmental Effects of Transportation of Fuel and
Waste to and from one Light-Water-Cooled Nuclear Power Plant, and
the Generic Environmental Statement on Mixed Oxide Fuel.

The preferred form for this information is a listing by intervenor rather than by proceeding.

The intent of this request is to develop a data base of recurring concerns of specific intervenors in separate proceedings. This would serve as guidance in preparing testimony for future proceedings to which these intervenors might be a party. By initially addressing the areas of concern to these groups or individuals such testimony should shorten the time required to conduct hearings and yield a direct savings in overall licensing time.
