Subject: FAILURE OF THREE OF FOUR MSIVS TO CLOSE DURING TESTING

During testing in the hot standby mode, three of the four Main Steam Line Isolation Valves (MSIV) failed to close when manually actuated. The cause of the occurrence was binding in the valve stem packing. The valve is air opened and is closed by gravity, steam flow and a small spring force. The licensee believes that the valves would have closed during actual operations with steam flow in the line. The valves were repaired and tested satisfactorily. Modifications to the valves to install air operators to help close the valves are being investigated by the licensee.

There has been no media interest in this event and no press releases are planned.
