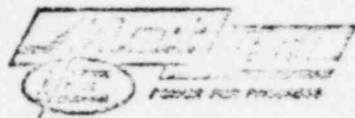

Subject: Abnormal Occurrence No. AO 74-20

Dear Mr. O'Reilly:

This telegram is to confirm the telecon between Lee Spessard (Region I-AEC), and J.J. Colitz (THI-Unit 1 Superintendent) at 1000 hours, October 31, 1974.

The following report is submitted in accordance with paragraph 6.7.2.a.4 (page 6-11) of the technical specifications.

During an inspection of the reactor building on October 30, 1974, hydraulic shock suppressor, number PR-50, located on the pressurizer electromagnetic relief valve discharge line, was found empty of hydraulic fluid.

The main cylinder lock nut was loose which permitted the cylinder to rotate approximately 90°, hit another pipe which caused a connection between the reservoir and the hydraulic cylinder to break and drain the hydraulic fluid.

The broken fitting was replaced, the hydraulic fluid was replaced, the suppressor reoriented and the lock nut tightened.

The failed suppressor has a 2½" cylinder with a 5" piston stroke which was manufactured by Grinnel.
