This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. G. L. Troup of this office on September 28 - October 1, 1976, of activities authorized by NRC Construction Permit No. CPPR-51 for the Crystal River 3 facility, and to the discussion of our findings held with Mr. J. Alberdi at the conclusion of the inspection.

Areas examined during the inspection and our findings are discussed in the relieved inspection report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of relective examination of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector.

Within the scope of this inspection, no items of noncompliance were disclosed.

In accordance with Section 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the NRC's Public Document Room.
