

6. Interrogatory

Did the mention of a 20-mile evacuation radius by Chairman Hendrie on Friday, March 30, lead to or result in the communication to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and its political subdivisions within 20 miles of TMI of a recommendation by the NRC for such governmental units to extend their emergency response capability to a distance from the plant of 20 miles?

- a. If yes, by whom and for what reason was this recommendation made?
- b. Has this recommendation been withdrawn? If yes, when, by whom, and for what reason(s)?

Response

The mention of a 20-mile evacuation by Chairman Hendrie on Friday, March 30 did not result in a Staff recommendation for a 20-mile evacuation. The Staff formulated evacuation recommendations which were given to State officials on Sunday, April 1. These recommendations, entitled "NRC Procedures For Decision to Recommend Evacuation" were supplied with the response to the ANGRY interrogatories dated January 21, 1980.

7. Interrogatory

Describe fully the "current conditions" on March 30 on the basis of which Chairman Hendrie made his judgement that a 20-mile evacuation might be necessary.

Response

A description of the current conditions before and on March 30, is in Chapters 1-16 of the Special Inquiry Group Report, entitled "A Report To The Commissioners And To The Public", NUREG/CR-1250, Vol. 1.

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
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
