Dear Senator Mathias:

We urgently need your help.

For a long time we have been stockholders of General Public Utilities Co. (GPU), in Pennsylvania, the parent company of Metropolitan Edison Co. The latter company owns two nuclear power plants at Three Mile Island, near Harrisburg.

After the accident in March, 1979, the Muclear Regulatory Commission properly suspended its license for Three Mile Island II, where the accident occurred.

But it has still failed to give permission to operate the adjoining Three Mile Island I plant, which had been shut down temporarily for routine reasons in March 1979-and which has been ready to function since last May. The Commission ignores a host of additional safety precautions instituted since the additional safety precautions instituted since the additional states.

The result is that GPU not only has omitted dividends, but is faced with possible bankruptcy by Aprril or May, with grave hardship to consumers and stockholders.

Won't you express to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission your deep concern over the harm they are inflicting on consumers and stockholders alike, through their arbitrary even vindictive position?
