Please reconsider opening the Limerick Power Plant. 153,000 people live within a 10 mile radius of the Limerick Reactors. 3.8 million live within 30 miles from Limerick. Penna. emergency response plans are no better than before the TMI accident. Paila. Electric is considering building fall-out shelters for those within a 10 mile radius of the plant as an alternative to evacuation. Penna. has not improved its radiation monitoring around existing reactors. Serious accidents can & will happen - a core meltdown (class 9 accident) could contaminate an area the size of the state of Penna. (From the Brookhaven Report Wash. 740). Limerick is located in too densely a populated area to ever be allowed to operate. It is immoral and unnecessary to produce radioactive wastes to generate electricity, especially when you don't know how to contain the waste. The Price Anderson Nuclear Insurance act sets a \$560 million limitation on liabilities for a nuclear accident, with

most of the funds to come from U.S. taxpayers  
This does not sound fair to me. The  
taxpayers never had a say on whether  
or not we wanted nukes in the first  
place. P.E. should pay for their own  
mistakes - not the innocent victim -  
the U.S. citizen. Homeowners insurance  
policies do not cover loss of life or
