Dear Mr. Klingaman:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter dated May 27, 1980 and a follow-up memo dated June 6, 1980 from S. C. Lane to Units 1 and 2 Supervisors, Messrs. Ross and Chwastyk as supplied by Mr. T. A. O'Conner, Lead Fire Protection Engineer, to Mr. F. J. Heagy of this office. Based on the information provided, it is the Department's opinion that fire training activities can be conducted without causing an air pollution problem. By this letter you are authorized to utilize the area designated in your aforementioned letter and memo for fire training purposes during the designated time interval only.

This approval is granted subject to the special conditions listed below:

- Training exercises shall be conducted between the hours of 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM.
- 2. Only the fuel specified in your letter shall be utilized.
- No burning shall be conducted if unfavorable atmospheric conditions prevail.
- 4. The Department shall be notified of any change in your proposal.

5. The Department may require the termination of any training exercise, if in the opinion of the Department, said termination is necessary to protect the air resources of the Commonwealth.

Failure to comply with the above conditions may result in the revocation of this approval.
