Dear Mr. Gossick;

As a member of the Town of Milan, N.H. Planning Board I have been appointed to address several concerns and questions relative to a proposed Hydro-Electric Pumped Storage/Nuclear Generating Facility in the Town of Milan, N.H. as proposed by the International Generating and Transmission Co. Inc. Box 600 Berlin, N.H. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission has an assigned case project number of 2825 regarding this matter and I have been advised by the FERC to contact you for answers to our concerns. The following are the questions that we would appreciate obtaining answers to:

- 1) Has the International Generation and Transmission Co. applied for any permits for the study of a proposed Nuclear Power Plant to be located in the Town of Milan N.H. ?
- 2) What are the jurisdictional areas of responsibility that the Planning Board has responsibility over in terms of the issuance of a building permit for such a plant, and also what types of jurisdiction does the Planning Board have over the subdivision of land for a Nuclear Plant?
- 3) Does the issuance of this particular permit, if granted hinge directly upon the FERC's approval of the hydro-pump storage portion of the proposed project?
- 4) Have there been any evacuation plans placed on file with your agency and if not when are these plans called for in terms of the progression of the process of licensing?

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- 5) Does the following Zoning Ordinance passed by the Town of Milan at its Town meeting of March 11, 1980 have any affect upon the legal considerations for the licensing of a Nuclear Plant in Milan, N.H. ?

"That the town prohibit the location of any nuclear powered electrical generating plant within its geographic boundaries, and that the zoning ordinances be amended to prohibit the storage of nuclear wastes within the geographic boundaries of the Town of Milan, N.H. "

- 6) Are there any public hearings scheduled within the foreseeable future relative to this issue and have there been any held in the past either public or private in nature?
- 7) May the Milan Planning Board be kept up to date through future correspondences from your agency of the status of this proposed project?

Any other useful information that you can provide us with will be greatly appreciated. Thank you in advance for your time and consideration of this matter.
