Response to I&E Bulletin No. 80-10

This letter responds to I&E Bulletin No. 80-10, concerning potential contamination of nonradioactive systems and resulting potential for unmonitored, uncontrolled releases of radioactivity to the environment. The actions taken as required by Bulletin Items 1 and 2 are as follows:

Item 1

The plant design and operation have been reviewed to identify systems considered nonradioactive, but could possibly become radioactive through system interfaces.

Item 2


Engineering reviews have concluded that there exists a routine sampling/analysis or monitoring program for each of the systems identified in Item 1, to promptly identify any contaminating events which could lead to unmonitored, uncontrolled liquid or gaseous releases to the environment.
