

Dear Mr. Felton:

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act ("Act") 5 U.S.C. 552, as amended. This request is made on behalf of Citizens for a Better Environment (CBE) and its members. Please provide the following documents:

- Correspondence from Commonwealth Edison Company (Edison) to the NRC, dated November 14, 1979, regarding technical specification modifications necessary for the decontaminat; of Dresden 1.
- Any and all other correspondence between NRC and Edison relating to the decontamination of Dresden 1, particularly correspondence dated after FOIA requests FOIA-79-544 (McCullough) and FOIA-78-217 (Hansell) and any other correspondence not included in those requests.
- 3. Any and all other correspondence between NRC and Dow Chemical Co., General Electric, the Department of Energy, Battelle Laboratories and any other participants involved in or providing advice, studies or reports concerning the decontamination of Dresden 1, which was not included in FOIA-79-544, FOIA-78-217 and FOIA-80-246.
- Any and all studies, documents, reports, proposals, etc., specified in FOIA-80-246 (dated 6 May 1980) in request numbers 1-10, which have become available since the response (15 May 1980) to that request.
- Any and all studies, comments, proposals, reports, etc., produced since December 1978 on the potential for corrosion of the primary cooling system or other piping due to the decontamination of Dresden 1.



In the unlikely event that access is denied to any part of the requested records, please describe the deleted material in detail and specify the statutory basis for the denial as well as your reasons for believing that the alleged statutory justification applies in this instance. Please state specifically your reasons for not involving your discretionary powers to release the requested document in the public interest.

We anticipate that you will make the requested materials available within the statutory period. We also request that you waive any applicable fees since disclosure meets the statutory standard for waiver of fees in that "furnishing the information can be considered as primarily benefiting the general public." 5 U.S.C. 552 (a)(4)(A).
