Dear Sir:

I live just 55 miles due east of Three Mile Island. I was ready to evacuate my wife and children if the recent crisis had become catastrophic. I had hoped the sense of responsibility and need for clear thinking of those at Three-Mile-Ed would have been sufficiently awakened to guarantee citizens continued safety. I continually come across reports to the contrary - namely that Three-Mile-Ed is acting irresponsibly in regards to the contaminated materials at TMI and endangering public health, life, and existence.

I have heard that on July 26, 9000 gallons of water containing contaminants such as deadly Strontium-90 were dumped in the Susquehanna. I have heard of plans to release millions of cubic feet of Krypton-85 into the atmosphere. Not only does that create great dangers, I understand that the public as well as state officials are not being warned of these releases. This unwarned, poisonous contamination of our natural spaces must stop! A safe and more responsible way of handling the TMI contaminants must be found and strictly implemented.
