DEAR COMMISSIONER HENDRIE,

AS AN ENGINEER WHO HAS STUDIED NUCLEAR SAFETY PROBLEMS FOR THE PAST TWO YEARS, I WISH TO SAY THAT I AGREE WITH THE RELENT DECISION TO EXTEND THE HOLD ON GRANTING NEW CONSTRUCTION PERMITS AND NEW OPERATING LICENCES. AT A CONFERENCE IN OAK RIDGE A WEEK AGO, THE ACCIDENT AT TMI WAS REVIEWED BY DR. RASMUSSEN, WHO ADMITTED THAT, BY HIS OWN WASH-1400 REPORT, THE LIKELIHOOD OF HAVING ANOTHER TMI-TYPE ACCIDENT WAS ABOUT 1 IN 3 EACH YEAR! A 33% CHANCE FOR A BILLION DOLLAR ACCIDENT, EVEN IF THERE ARE NO OUTRIGHT ACUTE FATALITIES, IS TOO GREAT A RISK.

YOU ARE ALSO CORRECT IN REVIEWING ALL PRESENTLY OPERATING PLANTS, SPECIALLY NEAR OUR CITIES, AND I HOPE THAT YOU CAREFULLY LOOK AT PILGRIM I, SO NEAR TO BOSTON. IF I CAN HELP, PLEASE CONTACT ME. (I HAVE A LETTER APPLICATION ON FILE WITH THE NRC THRU COMMISSIONER BRADFORD.)
