Do you believe there is any danger in my attending this conference, vis-a-vis the nuclear "event" that occurred earlier this year? Does the Nuclear egulatory Commission take measurements that far away from Three Mile Island?

I know that you are busy, and involved with many more important decisions than this. Nevertheless, the accident proved that we need a credible source of information for all citizens, so that they can make their own judgements about the matters I have discussed above. I would appreciate a reply from your or someone in your office at your earliest convenience, so that I can make plans for the conference.
