Mr Chairman Joseph Hendric,  
We are residents of south-  
central Pennsylvania and we  
are very concerned about the  
proposed release of two million  
cubic feet of radioactive gas  
into the atmosphere from unit  
two at T.M.I. Living only  
twenty-three miles from the  
plant I feel my family  
is in danger.

Metropolitan-Edison has stated  
that krypton 85 will be present  
in this release. We know that  
krypton 89 and 90 can not be  
separated from 85 and the isotopes  
decay into strontium 89 and 90.  
Strontium 90 is the most  
deadly of all radioactive  
isotopes.

We feel that Met-Ed must  
be convinced to close down  
T.M.I. as a nuclear power  
plant. Met-Ed should not be  
allowed to poison the people  
and food of south-central  
Pennsylvania and the  
surrounding areas.

You must convince  
Met-Ed and General Public  
Utilities to stop the proposed  
release, and shut down T.M.I.
