

Mr. President,

We are concerned citizens of south-central Penna. and we are concerned about the proposed release of two million cubic feet of radioactive gas into the atmosphere from unit 2 at T.M.I. Living only 23 miles from the plant we feel our family is in danger.

Met. Ed Co has stated that Krypton 85 will be present in this release. Krypton 89 and 90 can not be separated from 85 and these isotopes decay into strontium 89 and 90. Strontium 90 is the most deadly of all nuclear fission products.

We feel that Met Ed Co must be convinced to close down T.M.I. as a nuclear power plant.

They should not be allowed to
