No doubt the decision of November 5th to stop issuing construction permits and operating licenses for nuclear power plants makes good political sense. However, we feel that this certainly cannot be justified on the basis of the report of the Three Mile Island job or the history of the nuclear industry.

It is obvious that OPEC has noted our action with relations to nuclear power and have given us a present which will cost us considerably more. I am sure that you are aware that a typical nuclear plant replaces 10 million barrels of oil and it would seem to me that we must move ahead as rapidly as possible, making sure that the plants are constructed as safe as possible.

I certainly hope that in the light of the OPEC decision and the reality of today that you will reconsider your decision so this vital energy source will be utilized.
