Dear Jeana:

Your letter to President Carter about the accident at Three Mile Island has been referred to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. I regret that this answer has been delayed. The accident and its consequences have created a substantial increase in the agency's workload, which has prevented us from responding to you as promptly as we would have liked.

I am enclosing summaries of two reports for your information: (1) "Population Dose and Health Impact of the Accident at the Three Mile Island Nuclear Station" (NUREG-0558) and (2) "Investigation into the March 28, 1979, Three Mile Island Accident by the Office of Inspection and Enforcement" (NUREG-0600). The White House staff will answer your questions about President Carter.
