CHAIRMAN AHEARNE: The Commission will begin this afternoon by first holding an affirmation session and I would like to have a vote to hold that affirmation session on less than one weeks notice.

MR. CHILK: First paper is SECY-A-80-57 Diablo Canyon Release of Physical Security Plan Intervenors. Commission with Commissioner Kennedy not participating unanimously approved an order stating that the Appeal Board is not to release Diablo Canyon Physical Security Plans unless and until the Commission so directs. In conjunction with this approval, the Chairman was asked OGC to prepare a paper on the merits of the case by the end of the week. Will you please affirm the vote?

MR. CHILK: The second paper is the delegation of authority to issue subpoenas in connection with investigation of TMI. The Commission again unanimously has delegated authority to the Director of I&E to issue subpoenas under section 161 C of the Atomic Energy Act as amended to assist in the conduct of the investigation of Three Mile Island. The authority is not to be redelegated and will expire on June 10 in conjunction with this approval the Chairman has asked that OIA and Justice arrangements be worked out.
