Tuesday morning when I picked up my Lancaster Intelligence Journal I was shocked from my morning lethargy by the headline "Water dumped in river without Strontium 90 test."

According to NRC spokesman Karl Abraham 4,000 gallons of water was dumped in the Susquehanna before an NRC inspector "noticed" it. This is a direct violation of the agreement Met Ed made when they promised to check all water for Strontium 90.
