COMM. KENNEDY: The Commission meets for affirmation

session. John?

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MR. HOYLE: The first item for affirmation session is SECY 80-156. It is the disposition of ---

(NOISE FROM AUDIENCE)

COMM. KENNEDY: Could we please have quiet so we could hear what we have to hear?

MR. HOYLE: The first item has to do with the disposition of FOIA Appeal to the Commission. The Commission has voted five to nothing to withhold portions of two memoranda and one complete memorandum. This will be --

COMM. KENNEDY: This being 156?

MR. HOYLE: Yes. This will release additional -an additional eight documents to the requester. And may I have an affirmation of the proposals?

(Chorus of ayes)

MR. HOYLE: The second, item is SECY A 80-39. This
is review of two ALABS in Sharon Harris Nuclear Power
Plant case. By a vote of four to nothing with Chairman
Ahearne concurring in part and dissenting in part -- has
agreed to approve a memorandum and order in this case.
Chairman Ahearne concurs in the decision that the
Appeals Board lacked authority to direct the Staff in

this case but dissents from the decision not to grant

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1 the applicant's petition to review ALAB 581. May I 2 have your affirming votes, please. (Chorus of ayes.) 4 MR. HOYLE: The third item is SECY 80-159. This 4 paper requests the delegation of authority to regional 6 directors to issue orders to licensees during an emergency? By a vote of five to nothing, the Commission has approved 8 a memorandum containing this delegation of authority with đ the addition that the determinations will be made by 10 the director of the executive management team. May I 11 have your affirmation, please. 12 (Chorus of aves.) 13 MR. HOYLE: The final item is SECY 80-119, an 14 ENO determination for the Three Mile Island accident. 15 By a vote of five to nothing, the Commission has approved 14 the text of the determination which indicates that the 17 Three Mile Island occurrence was not an extraordinary 18 nuclear occurrence. 19 On page 21, there is a footnote in which 20 Commissioners Gilinsky and Bradford indicate that they 21 do not believe that the Heidleburg Report is relevant 22 22 to this ENO determination. With that, though, the text 24 of the determination has been approved by all of you. 22 May I have your affirmation, please?

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(Chorus of ayes.)

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MR. HOYLE: Thank you.

1 COMMISSIONER BRADFORD: John, I want to be 4 quoted as being against the issuance of disabling 5 license today. 6 MR. HOYLE: Yes, sir. You will be recorded. Okay. You were not in the room at the time of the vote. 2 COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: I must say I'm surprised the 9 vote was taken. 10 CHAIRMAN AHEARNE: I'm surprised you weren't in 11 the room. 12 MR. HOYLE: You didn't say anything. If you 13 had said that you wanted to hold the vote, I would 14 have held the vote. 15 COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: I didn't realize you 16 were right at the end of the meeting. It's all right. 17 It's done. 18 MR. HOYLE: The meeting finished and you sat 10 here. 20 CHAIJMAN AHEARNE: Well, why don't you go ahead 21 and allow Mr. Gilinsky to cast his vote. We just 22 allowed Mr. Bradford too. I would vote we do that. 22 COMMISSIONER GILINSKY: Well, I would have 24 25 proposed putting off an affirmation next week, but anyway INTERNATIONAL VERSATIN REPORTERS INC.
