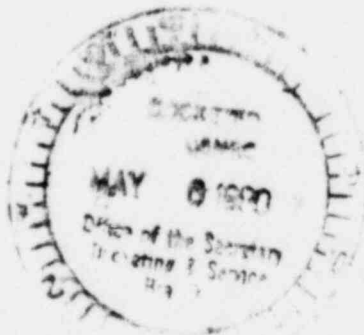
As a resident of Louisville, I have many grave concerns over the construction of the Marble Hill nuclear plant in Indiana. I would like to see that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission NOT give Public Service Indiana a construction permit until the FBI investigative report on the matter is completed.

Further, I believe that all construction at Marble Hill should be stopped until engineers from "Save the Valley" association are permitted to inspect the work and offer their independent conclusions.

I don't really care how much money is at stake for PSI in this matter, for no price can be placed on the health, welfare, and very lives of the one and a half million people who live within a dangerous radius of Marble Hill.

Dear Mr. Chilk,

I am writing to tell the NRC that I do not want Public Service Indiana to resume construction of the safety related buildings at the Marble Hill Plant, Madison, Indiana. It is beyond belief to us that NRC would even consider allowing PSI to complete construction and then operate a nuclear plant. This company has been arrogantly, criminally irresponsible from the start. Citizens, not the NRC, discovered the construction debacle. I confess, we have no faith in PSI or the NRC. At this point, the plant is a financial disaster, the power is not needed in the Ohio Valley and we feel it is extremely unfair to the citizens of Kentucky and Indiana to try to force us to accommodate this unwanted nuclear installation in our lives.

We are afraid of it, of low level radiation contamination of our air and water. Nuclear power is experimental and we refuse to be sacrificial victims. The NRC is asking us to breathe poisoned air and <sup>drink</sup> poisoned water emitted from Marble Hill. We say such a request is a totalitarian imposition, unacceptable to a free people.

There is an FBI investigation we want to know about. Must we go to court again to learn the information we paid tax dollars for the FBI to gather? Region III has said that a Save The Valley chosen engineer would be permitted to inspect the current construction repairs..How can Region III possibly recommend resumption of construction before these two factors are known to the public?

I am a conservationist and occupied Marble Hill in October, 1978 because I believe the plant is a direct threat to the flora and fauna of the Ohio River Valley. We reject the assumption that this area (including the eastern Kentucky coal fields) is to be a "national sacrifice area".

Summon your courage, please, and tell PSI that it must abandon Marble Hill. Thank you very much.

It has been brought to our attention that your commission will have a hearing during the week of May 5 to review a request by Public Service Indiana to resume construction at Marble Hill. We wish to say that it would be premature to grant this request at the present time due to the fact that an investigation is now under way by the FBI. We urgently request that your decision be delayed until this FBI report is completed.

Further, we feel that more careful investigation and inspection must be carried out at Marble Hill. Therefore we are requesting that all construction be stopped until engineers from "Save the Valley" be allowed to inspect the work. Everyone knows that patched up concrete is not going to be safe. We will have to have some assurance that proper repair work is instigated.

Your consideration is urgently requested.

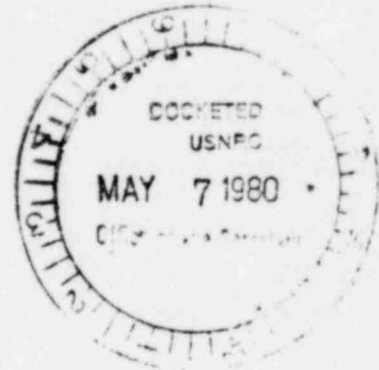

I am corresponding concerning the hearing on May 7, 1980 on Marble Hill Nuclear Plant and Public Service Indiana.

I would like to respectfully request that Public Service Indiana not be given a construction permit until the United States Federal Bureau of Investigation has completed its report and the report has been acted upon.

A further request would be that all construction be stopped until independent engineers be allowed to inspect the facilities. These inspections could be provided by Save the Valley, but I am sure any non-partisan firm of your selection would be acceptable.

As a resident of Jefferson County, Kentucky, I would like to voice my concern and reflect the uneasiness of residents of my area about the continued construction at Marble Hill.

I believe the Nuclear Regulatory Commission holds a sacred trust, and that both morally and legally it is responsible for the ultimate safety of our citizens. I ask you to fully respect these obligations and place Marble Hill on hold until we can assure that all necessary safety factors have been addressed,


