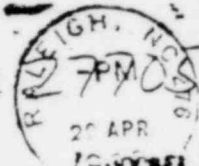

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While it is evident the NRC is trying to improve radiation protection standards (or at least give that impression) I am struck by the omission of 2 concepts: dose commitment and the acceptable effect of radiation exposure on both genes and living beings. Unless dose commitment is assured, by a safety factor of 10 or more, to be held below the limit where it could be expected to cause any deaths or genetic effects, I wouldn't think the standards adequate. Also the idea of disposing radioactive material below certain levels of activity as "non-radioactive" is absurd + dangerous hell system.
