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

Subject: Access Controls to Nuclear Power Plant Vital Areas - Proposed Rule (45 FR 15937 - 3/12/80)

Dear Sir:

Yankee Atomic Electric Company appreciates the opportunity to comment on the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's subject proposed rule. Yankee Atomic owns and operates a Nuclear Power generating plant in Rowe, Massachusetts. The Yankee Nuclear Services Division also provides engineering services for other nuclear power plants in the Northeast including Vermont Yankee, Maine Yankee and Seabrook 1 and 2.

We have the following comments on the proposed part 73.55(d)(7):

Paragraph (i) could be interpreted as requiring the licensee to identify, in advance, the date and <u>duration</u> for each access to a vital area. If advance identification as to date and duration has to be made each and every time access to a vital area is required, the security system will become overwhelmed with non-productive paper work. Constantly updating and republishing access lists will become an unnecessary irritant to the plant staff and the main function of security personnel, rather than more important tasks directly related to a good security program. This paragraph should be revised so that it is understood that employees having a work related continual need to enter vital areas, to perform routine maintenance inpsection, or surveillance, may have this approved access.

Paragraph (iv) establishes requirements to prevent "tailgating". This paragraph could be interpreted as a requirement for additional equipment. One positive way to <u>assure</u> prevention of tailgating would be through use of a turnstile or a security officer at each vital entry point. This is considered unsatisfactory from a safety, operational and

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economic point of view. Replacing the word "assure" with "obtain reasonable assurance" would be consistent with the intent.
