Dear Mr. Grimes:

Enclosed is the upgraded draft of the Commonwealth Edison Company Generating Stations Emergency Plan (GSEP)-Revision O. The revised GSEP, originally submitted in draft form with Reference (a), has been modified to address the comments received from Messrs. W. Axelson (Directorate of Inspection and Enforcement-Region III) and D. Kunihiro (NRR), the NRC Staff members conducting the review of the Commonwealth Edison emergency preparedness program. In addition, the enclosed materials address the interim guidance on emergency response plans contained in NURF 1-1654 (Reference (b)). Also enclosed is the revision to the Lasalle Tounty Emergency Action Levels List (Table LA 5.0-1 in the Lasalle Inty GSEP Annex) requested by Mr. Axelson.

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and comments relative to the Commonwealth Edison emergency preparedness program. There are certain sections of the plan that full implementation are discussed in the GSEP/NUREG-0654 Cross are being revised to provide comparable additional information as was provided in the LaSalle County Emergency Action Level List Quad Cities, Zion, and LaSalle County Stations is planned for May 30, 1980.

The formal utility acceptance review of the revised GSEP is now in process within Commonwealth Edison. It is expected that this review will be completed by May 30, 1980. Therefore, you are later than May 23, 1980 so that those comments can be considered in our review. It is essential that this review schedule be maintained to allow for timely implementation of the revised GSEP.

In that regard, it is our intention as indicated in Reference (c) to upgrade the GSEP and associated Emergency Plan Implementing Procedures (EPIP's) now in effect by July 1, 1980 to parameters and instrumentation. In addition, the Emergency Action notification of the NRC for events in the emergency classes implementation of the upgraded GSEP shall be upgraded to require described in NUREG-0610 (Draft) - September, 1979. Full conjunction with implementation of the Category "B" items in NUREG-0578; many of which are incorporated into the upgraded Plan, Emergency Operations Center, etc.

As you are aware full implementation and adoption of the upgraded plan is contingent upon satisfactory completion of an appropriate emergency response exercise(s). It is currently our plan to conduct such an excerise in conjunction with State and Local authorities during the summer of 1980 at one of our operating authorities. In addition, an exercise involving Local will be conducted prior to the scheduled fuel loading date of both the NRC Staff and FEMA review of the emergency preparedness expeditiously to support the current license review schedule for
